Bodie

Established as a mining camp in 1859, Bodie boomed after sizable¹ gold discoveries during the 1870s. The town was in decline by the 1910s; the newspaper ceased publication in 1912, and the railway was abandoned in 1918. The last mine closed in 1942.

Bannack

Founded in 1862, Bannack was briefly the capital of Montana. Up to 10,000 people lived in the surrounding area, hoping to make their fortune in gold, but by 1870 all the easy-to-reach¹ ore² was gone and the population rapidly declined to the hundreds. [...] Today, about 60 intact structures remain.

Saint-Elmo

This well-preserved ghost town attracted over 2,000 residents by the 1880s, when gold and silver mining were at their peak¹. [...] Poor quality ore sent the town into decline by the end of the decade². [...] The industry abandoned the town for good in 1936.

Many, very many, that come here meet with bad success & thousands will leave their bones¹ here. Others will lose their health, contract diseases that they will carry to their graves² with them. Some will have to beg³ their way home, & probably one half that come here will never make enough to carry them back. [..] There is a good deal⁴ of sin & wickedness⁵ here, stealing, lying, swearing, drinking, going on gambling⁶ & murdering. Along the desert drive to Las Vegas sits the famous silver mining ghost town known as Calico Ghost Town.

Calico is an Old West mining town that has been around since 1881 during the most significant silver strike¹ in California.

It had well over 500 mines and produced over \$20 million in silver ore over a 12-year time span². In the mid-1890s, silver lost its value, and so Calico also lost its population.

Today, the park is open for mine tours, gunfight shows, and gold panning³. Other highlights include the Calico & Odessa Railroad, an old mining building you can actually go into, and various shops.

Calico is a great place to spend a few hours of your day road-tripping to Death Valley National Park or Las Vegas. It is open daily and requires an entrance fee.
